Many business students have received Boren Awards, studying languages, taking relevant coursework, and researching economic issues in Africa, Asia, Central & Eastern Europe, Eurasia, Latin America, and the Middle East. Here are some examples of what business students have done overseas with a Boren Award:

- Researched the role of solar energy in job creation for the female workforce in Bangladesh
- Interned at an NGO designing, managing, and implementing sustainable development programs throughout Thailand and profiled 500 micro and small enterprise owners to illuminate their barriers to growth
- Researched the availability of credit to small business owners in China
- Interned with an international development consulting firm in the Republic of Georgia and researched administrative barriers that impede foreign and domestic investment
- Studied Modern Standard Arabic at the University of Jordan Language Center in Amman, Jordan
- Studied Swahili language, cultural and development topics, and disparities in education in Kenya

Examples of Service

Boren Alumni have fulfilled their service requirement in a variety of federal positions related to business and economics. Examples include:

- An economic development advisor on a U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) project to establish and develop farmer associations in southern Serbia
- A consultant for the African Development Foundation working with partners in Nigeria to develop project proposals for new small and medium sized enterprises
- An advisor for the Micro and Small Finance Enterprise Facility, working with local banks in Kyrgyzstan to set up micro lending departments
